JUST in time for the festive season, an ex-Toti musician's band's CD has been made available locally.



Willem Veenman will be remembered

THEIR hearts became intertwined through a runaway ball of wool but now the yarn of "The Book Man and The Knitting Lady" has finally reached its end.

Wim and Anne Veenman, residents of many years standing in the local community, celebrated their diamond wedding anniversary on 5 November. Their story book romance began with a twist in a railway

It lasted through 60 years of faithful commitment that only death severed. After reaching a milestone in love and marriage, Wim died on 10 November. Wim and Anne are well remembered by many as "The Book Man and The Knitting Lady."

They ran a little stall together at the old Toti CBD and later used a cart in the hallway at Winkle Pick n Pay. It was always filled with Anne's knitted wares and piled high with Wim's secondhand books. It was a familiar and well-loved landmark.

Then tragedy struck one sad weekend about 10 years ago, when Anne suddenly became blind almost overnight. However, in spite of the handicap, the two continued with their little business for some time after that.

Anne still busied herself plying her knitting needles. She cut a brave figure in dark glasses, while Wim, always her champion, sat faithfully beside her.

Willem Veenman, or Wim as he was known, was born in Holland on August 18, 1932. He was the youngest of eight chil-

during the Second World War, he personally experienced the hunger pangs and deep sorrow of families torn apart by the ravages of warfare.

To save him from starvation, his mother sent him to an orphanage where he could at least be fed. But the orphanage was destroyed by German bombs and Wim, as a very little boy, found himself plodding along, walking in a line, one of many ragged starving people with no concept of time or place.

Wim was so infested with lice that his clothing was virtually moving on his thin little body. A German soldier noticed him and picked him out of the line.

This action no doubt saved him from death through disease and starvation. Wim was sent to a kindly farmer and his wife as a foster child of war.

Happily, at the end of World War Two, he was reunited with his own family in Rot-

Wim came to South Africa as a humble young railwayman in search of his fortune and he found riches indeed. On a train ride to Durban, he met the love of his life.

Then a pretty young girl of 19, Anne was seated on the train, serenely knitting, when a twist in the track seemingly gave the ball of wool a life of its own.

It dropped off her lap and proceeded to skip down the aisle, unravelling itself between the leather seats in a tangled web. Sensing a wonderful opportunity to introduce himself, Wim went scrabbling on all fours after it.

His gallant act and subsequent winding up of the wool caused their hearts to become intertwined. A few months later, they tied a permanent nuptial knot that was to last for 60 memorable years.

Wim is survived by his wife, Anne, who lives with their eldest daughter, Cheryl-Anne and her husband, Edwin Potgieter of Queens Terrace, Doonside. Wim is also survived by two siblings, older sisters who are residents in Holland.

He leaves behind two sons, Warren and Leon, as well as two daughters, Grace and Erika and their respective spouses and is survived by 10 grandchildren, a great grandchild and a great great grandchild. Riches indeed.

Attorney cheats death again

AMANZIMTOTI attorney Yolandi van der Watt, who almost died in a shooting incident in Doonside in February, has had another close escape after three men invaded her Shulton Park house on Friday, 9 December.

Yolandi, her husband, two young children and elderly mother were asleep in their Vasco Da Gama home when three young men smashed their main bedroom window with a spade to gain entry at about

"My youngest daughter was asleep with us in the bed," said Yolandi. "My 61-yearold mother came into the room when she heard the noise and we fought them off. Fortunately they were not armed, although they pretended to be. One of them hit my mother and she fell."

The family fought back so fiercely, the men decided they had had enough, grabbed car keys and fled, but dropped the keys on the way out.

Yolandi had the presence of mind to hit the panic button as soon as they broke the window and their security company and Toti SAPS were quick to respond.

A month earlier the family lost all their electronic devices after their lounge was ransacked as they slept.

Fortunately Yolandi's three-year-old daughter slept through the commotion and her 18-month-old daughter, who usually sleeps in her cot by the window, was in bed

Her mother was taken to hospital as she was bleeding profusely.

"We are lucky to be alive," said Yolandi, who was full of praise for the CCPO who checked up on the family the following

"If they had been armed, it would have been a different story. We hit, kicked and screamed as we fought them off. It was the most vicious and brutal attack. They had no fear. They crashed through the window right on top of us. It was absolute madness."

Yolandi has only just recovered from her shooting ordeal in February. She was handling a divorce case, and had arrived at Sunsands flats in Beach Road to accompany 62-year-old Belinda Els while she removed her clothing from the flat she shared with her estranged husband, Nicolaas Els

On their arrival, Nicolaas went to the eighth-floor flat of his brother-in-law. Richard Northmore (60) and shot him in the left shoulder. Fortunately he survived

Els then ran down to the first floor where he shot and killed the caretaker of the block of flats and Yolandi's father Butch, as well as his own wife, before killing himself.

Yolandi was shot in the neck and back of the head at point blank range. She spent six weeks in St Augustine's Hospital, two in ICU, and six weeks in rehab.

"I just want 2016 to end," said Yolandi. "It has been such a traumatic year for me."

Big bad bangs

ANIMALS have very acute hearing.

Loud bangs and whistles may cause them actual pain in their ears.

But by following these simple guidelines your pet need not suffer.

Dogs, cats and fireworks

- * Always keep dogs and cats inside when fireworks are being let off.
- * Make sure your dog is walked earlier in the day before the fireworks start.
- * Close all windows and doors, and block off catflaps to stop pets escaping and to keep noise to minimum. Draw the curtains, and if the animals are used to the sounds of TV or radio, switch them on (but not too loudly) in order to block out some of the noise of the
- * Ensure dogs wear some form of easily readable identification, even in the house. They should have at least a collar and tag.
- * Think about fitting pets with a microchip, so that if they do run away they have a better chance of being quickly reunited with you.
- * Prepare a den for your pet where it can feel safe and comfortable, perhaps under a bed with some of your old clothes. They may like to hide there when the fireworks start.
- * Avoid leaving your pet alone during such potentially upsetting events. If you do have to leave the house, don't get angry with your pet if you find they have been destructive or toileted after being left on its own. Shouting at a frightened pet will only make them more stressed.

Remedies to use:

- 1. CalmEze tablets or gel
- 2. Eco-fear
- 3. Put a T-shirt or pet jacket on your pet.

Importantly, contact your vet for remedies you can use for your pets.

- * THE overloading of heavy vehicles on Natal's Roads remains unacceptably high and firgures released by the Natal Provincial Administration's Road branch reveal that in October 47% of vehicles weighed were overloading. At the Winklespruit weigh bridge 400 vehicles were weighed in October and of those 281 were overloaded.
- * THE two whale sharks that beached themselves on Kingsburgh beaches last week will provide nourishing sustenance for 4,000 baby crocodiles due to hatch in the next few weeks.

The manager of Crocworld crocodile farm near Scottburgh, Angus Drummond, was quick off the mark last Wednesday when he heard that a massive whale shark had beached at Warner Beach. Realizing that the Kingsburgh municipal faced the massive task of getting the carcass off the beach and then disposing of about six tons of meat, Angus offered to take all the meat for food for his crocodiles.

The plan by two of the largest agencies in the town, Fred Lemmer Estates and Usher and Hatch, is to ban the erection of all 'for sale' boards.



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RETURNING to where it all started at Moses Mabhida Stadium, Red Bull Unlocked saw the country's top skating talent descend on eThekwini on Sunday, 18 December where Durbanite Dlamini Dlamini landed some of the hottest tricks in the final to take

The 62 invited skaters from all over South Africa were whittled down to five on a specially-built course at People's Park.

Best trick went to Durban's Simon Stipcich, while the final was a fiercely-fought contest between Dlamini, Gavin 'Moses' Adams (Cape Town), Brandon Valjalo (Jozi), Braxton Haynes (Durban) and Jeremy Stone (Jozi) each pushing each other to lay it all down on the course.

'There were good skaters out there," said Dlamini. "We all know each other so it didn't feel like a competition, it was just good fun with good vibes.'

Of his line, he said: "I didn't really plan my moves. The course was really quick. so as soon as you landed, the next obstacle was there waiting for you. You had to create your own run and think out of the box. It's an art."

Tasked with the tough job of judging the country's best skaters were Luke Jackson of Session Magazine, Riaan van Biljoen of NSA and Brendan Body of The Shred Skateboard Park and Session Magazine, each integral roleplayers in South Africa's skateboarding scene.

"It was a really great event, the level of skating was high and the weather was perfect, if a bit hot," said Jackson, editor of Session Magazine. "The course was really interesting. There aren't a lot of events designed around a feature as such, it's usually just at a skate park. But today's Red Bull Unlocked was at one of the most iconic venues in South Africa."

Jackson said openness of the venue really gave the skaters more freedom and options,

encouraging creativity which was appreciated by some 500 spectators.

"There's nothing else like this in the country," he continued. "The best trick event was definitely a highlight. They had designed a kicker up to the water feature in the centre of People's Park which the skaters had to shoot over. It was great how the existing structures had been incorporated into the contest."

6 reasons not to give pets as gifts

1. 5. This time of year is potentially the busiest of all, leaving little room for bonding between the pet and new owner - an extremely important part of pet ownership. It will also be very tough to establish any type of routine between year-end functions and New Year's parties, which pets truly thrive on, so it's quite possibly the worst time of year to get a pet, especially if you were not prepared for it.

O. There are more responsible ways to make a difference, such as making a donation to a rescue centre on behalf of someone else, or, at the very least, ensuring the receiver does indeed want a pet, and then rather gifting them pet supplies so that they can make their own decision about the pet they finally adopt.

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
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Mazda 2 1.5 DE Auto

By Miles Downard azda has undergone something of a revival since its split from Ford. The company is hammering out some great looking machines, at great prices, with great results. This is one of the newer offerings, called the Mazda 2. It's not a new nameplate, with this B segment hatch having been around for some time, but trust me everything else about it is.

On the outside: Stunning little thing isn't it? Nice and edgy in places, rounded and voluptuous in others. In red it's especially striking. There can't be any complaints in this department.

On the inside: If there's one spot that the new generation Mazda falls down a little it's the interior, but only because of how striking the exteriors are. I suppose you expect that to continue, but it doesn't quite. Instead you're met with a clean and simple layout in the 2.

An 'i-drive' type toggle allows one to navigate through the infotainment system and other gadgets on offer there (like navigation in this top spec model). Dials and switch placement is ergonomically satisfying.

Space wise there's enough to be competitive in the segment. The boot isn't quite wide enough for a set of golf clubs, for example, but otherwise it is deep and spacious.

Behind the wheel: This 1.5 DE model indicates it's got a turbocharged oil burner under the bonnet. It's a 1.5-litre of

course, good for 77kW and 250 torques. An auto 'box delivers power to the front wheels. It's a remarkable combination, probably the best small diesel auto combination I've ever driven to be honest.

Mazda has worked magic with power delivery and gearing. And fuel economy. Man this thing sips frugally at the tank, even producing sub 5 litres per hundred kilometres in stop start town conditions.

Pricing: The Mazda 2 1.5 DE Hazumi is R294,600. Might sound expensive for what is in essence a small hatchback. But compared with the rest of the segment, bearing in mind this has navigation, cruise control, climate control and a few other goodies, it's very competitive.

Verdict

LINE this up against any other diesel in the class and I'd take the Mazda every time. It's different, looks great, drives like a dream, is super economical and comes fully loaded. What more could you want?

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2) VW Tiguan

Crossovers. SUVs. Soft-roaders. The line between them all is a little blurred.

Call them what you want, however, this is arguably the fastest-growing class of car with legions of manufacturers fielding entrants, most of which will never leave a sealed surface.

But it's the all-new VW Tiguan that

comes top of the compact SUV class. It's a little larger, and a little lighter than the outgoing Tiggy - and way more attractive and refined with lashings of high-tech. Quality inside and out is up there in the premium league.

Go for the versions equipped with VW's excellent DSG self-shifter if you can.

Ever since the little SJ 410 jeeplet hit our shores in the Eighties, Suzuki has proven that if it does one thing well - so very well - it's small cars. Witness but the peppy, perky Celerio, our favourite in the budget segment.

The all-new Baleno reinforces this, and while this hatchback is just a little larger than the solid Swift, it's also around 11-percent lighter.

So even though there's only a (proven) 1.4-litre naturally aspirated engine under the hood, urge is ample, the price is right, equipment levels are high, and it's not likely to break.

4) Opel Astra

Tough, this. The 11-generation Opel Astra is pitched against the VW Golf, the default choice in this category.

But it sharply ups the ante over the previous Astra, while it's also a bit smaller and lighter quite a feat in this age where cars seem to get larger and lardier with each incarnation.

It's solid and refined with excellent equipment levels, too.

A trio of turbopetrol engines are available. Me? I especially like the 1.4T versions teamed with Opel's six-speed auto.

The Astra is also - no accident this - the current European Car of the Year.

5) Volvo V60 Cross Country

In the world of Volvo it's the XC90 - SA's current Car of the Year - that has been snatching the glory. But if I could have one Volvo - actually make that one car - around the half-a-bar mark for all-weather, all-road, all-purpose use it would quite likely be the V60 Cross Country. It's essentially a rugged-looking, high-riding version of the V60 estate.

And with all-wheel-drive and great ground clearance, plus lashings of the Swedo-cool that this manufacturer so effortlessly executes, it's also a reminder that perhaps we don't all need

6) BMW 7 Series

In the hyper-luxury super saloon category, the competition is fierce from everything from the Jaguar XJ to the Audi A8 to, of course, the Mercedes S-Class. But in this segment minute differences in quantifiable concerns such as output and luxury and technology are perhaps not as important as subjective ones.

So while this sixth-generation super-BMW is the most advanced in its class by virtue of being the newest, for many its real appeal will lie in the fact that it turns in physics-defying handling and performance for such a large car.

If you're being driven it's the Merc you want. If you're doing the driving, get the 7 Series.

7) Toyota Hilux

The all-new Hilux has quite an act to follow. After all, this bakkie has become part of the warp and weft of our society since its 1969 introduction. Not for fun is the term "legendary" often attached to it. So is it up to the task?

Yes, and yes again.

It's far more refined than before - particularly the up-spec models - and it's available in over 20 derivatives. If you can, opt for the versions using the new 2.4 GD-6 and 2.8 GD-6 turbodiesels - also available in the Hilux's sibling, the new Fortuner. A vehicle whose refinement, styling, and desirability is sharply upped, too. Of course, that fabled toughness is all part of the package.

8) Mercedes-Benz E-Class

The mighty Merc S-Class has always been at the very cutting-edge of Benz technology.

But that mantle has just passed to the new E-Class, arguably the most technologically advanced car you can buy, being virtually semiautonomous.

Of course, Merc hallmarks such as a calming, balming ride, high perceived quality, and the uncanny ability to shrink distances are all part of the deal.

Look out for the E 220d running a high-tech new turbodiesel.

9) Mahindra KUV100

What? What is this little SUV-ish thing doing here? It doesn't belong. It's certainly not one of the 10 best cars I've driven in 2016, with areas that need to be improved on - especially refine-

But the reason it's here is that the KUV100 is a huge leap forward for Mahindra.

This Indian company's products are evolving, and fast at that, so expect it to soon be a major player on our market. Remember when Korean cars first hit our shores two decades ago they were mediocre at best. Look at them now.

10) Audi A4

Subtlety and subtle evolution is the name of the game at Audi. So while its latest A4 might look a lot like the outgoing car it is, in fact, all-new as well as lighter and a little larger with new engines and a new seven-speed S tronic selfshifter replacing the old CVT 'box.

The interior especially is beautifully executed, and while this car competes with the worthy Mercedes C-Class and BMW 3 Series, it represents restrained elegance. Not a car for flashy extroverts, wide boys, and people who like doing carpark doughnuts on Saturday nights.



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Mahindra KUV100

An Indian surprise

By Gavin Foster very now and again a car pops up that sur-prises the bejabbers out of me because it delivers the unexpected. One such case was the new Mahindra KUV100, a recently-launched funky little

Mahindra's been in South Africa for around 15 years, but in all that time I'd never even sat inside any of their products until I recently got my paws on a XUV500 that offered excellent value despite some obvious costcutting with the interior trim.

About five months ago the Indian manufacturer quietly introduced the KUV, and since then sales have grown to between 100 and 150 per month, often more than all of their other six models combined.

The KUV looks sweet, although the origin of its name is more saccharine - Kool Utility Vehicle. It's styled a little differently to its rivals and I enjoyed its lines. It's small but has more than adequate interior space for four adults, and the interior is made up mostly of quality bits laid out attractively and sensibly.

There are three specification levels - K4, K6 and K8 - with the K6 and K8 versions progressively adding features, and the only thing missing from the basic model that really matters is a sound system.



for the petrol K4 to R179,995 for the K8.

The two fancier models are also available with diesel engines that push their prices up by R18,000.

The test car was a K8 with Mahindra's 1.2-litre naturallyaspirated petrol engine that doles out 61kW and 115Nm. It is, typically for a three-cylinder motor, a gruff little number and I liked it for the character it adds to the car. This engine takes more than 15 seconds to haul the car to 100km/h and tops out at 140km/h, but because of its nature it feels livelier than that.

The turbodiesel version has Pricing ranges from R149,995 just 57kW of power, but its

190Nm of torque from 1,750rpm should inject a little urgency into the car's nature.

All models come with crisp five-speed manual gearboxes, with a stubby little gear-lever protruding from the dash quite close to your left hand on the steering wheel.

One of the best features of the little Indian car though lies in its ride quality. It's plush without being over sloppy, and for a city car of this nature it's close to perfect.

The Mahindra KUV100 comes with a three-year 100,000km warranty and a threeyear 50,000km service plan for the K6 and K8. The latter is an option for the K4 version.



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Tata workhorse bakkie improved

ata's 207DI EX2, single cab workhorse one-ton bakkie has been refined with several visual and practical improvements. Good news is that it still retains its renounced load-capable dropside loadbox which has a flat floor.

The exterior has been spruced up with some bold decals along the side and on the bonnet, as well as new-look wheel covers. A very

practical cab protector is another addition to the specification.

The big improvement in the cab is the fitment of comfortable, cloth-trimmed bucket seats.

'We have managed to retain the selling price at a very competitive R169,995 despite the added specification, as part of our aim to offer value-for-money to buyers of Tata vehicles," explained Larry Da Costa, General Manager Sales and Operations of Accordian Investments, a subsidiary of Imperial, which markets and distributes Tata passenger cars and light commercial vehicles in South Africa.

This workhorse has been a mainstay in the Tata LCV lineup for years and is a no-nonsense bakkie that is rugged, durable and reliable. It is aimed squarely at the business community with no pretences about being a transport alternative to a passenger car.

The Tata workhorse is powered by a 3-litre turbocharged diesel engine producing 52kW of power and 225Nm of torque. It drives the live rear axle through a five-speed manual gearbox.

The Tata workhorse bakkie is covered by a threeyear/100,000km factory warranty plus road side assistance.




