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# Beetge slams city's 'empty promises'

WARD 97 councillor, Andre Beetge lambasted the city for its inability to fulfil budget promises made last year.

Cllr Beetge, who is also the Democratic Alliance spokesman for the Municipal Public Accounts Committee (Mpac), pointed out deficiencies and discrepancies in housing, water, electricity, cleaning and solid waste, rates, and Metro Police during his response to the proposed R45.8-billion budget tabled by Mayor Zandile Gumede during the State of the City address in Durban City hall on Thursday, 31 May.

"In 2017 the municipality only delivered 3,591 new houses against a then demand of 400,000. In 2018 we only delivered 3,161 units – 430 units less than the previous year, so the budget remained underspent," said Cllr Beetge.

In 2017 promises were made that the province would reimburse the municipality for the R3.98bn bridging finance provided to supply houses in 2016. "Not one cent has since found its way back to the ratepayers of eThekweni. The province now refuses to repay the money, claiming the land now no longer belongs to them," he said.

Cllr Beetge also said the budget is notably lacking in funding towards providing residents with title deeds. "Why not put promise to action and grant people the right to legally own a little bit of land?"

"Despite promising that 14,400 new water connections would be installed during this financial year, only 1,729 have thus far been achieved, 12,671 short of

expectation – yet the budget appears spent? Whether plans to employ 140 community-based and connected contractors to fast-track the process will yield the desired outcome is left to be seen."

Cllr Beetge said the municipality buys water for R238m but loses roughly R86m or 36% of the water bought due to non-existing maintenance and shortage of water meters and pressure relief valves (PRVs), which further strains the aging infrastructure.

"Instead of maintenance, repairs consume most of the R455m repairs and

maintenance budget – pre-mature legislation in terms of local content for meters and PRVs and demands by local labour forums in the name of radical economic transformation seems set to increase the total expenditure budget to R6.9b, an increase of R744m (11.7%) over the previous year.

The municipality obviously hopes to offset these losses by a 15% increase in water tariffs for domestic and 15.5% for business, as opposed to the 13.7% raised by bulk supplier Umgeni Water. But then again, someone has to foot the bill if the city hopes to employ an additional 1,389 plumbing contractors in the run-up to the elections."

He said the reported new electricity connections of 9,671 falls far short of the annual target of 22,000, yet the budget increases by R1bn (7.5%) to a staggering R14.4bn for 2018/19.

With regard to cleaning and solid waste, Beetge is astounded that the city remains drowning in filth and waste with a staggering six-year high budget of R2.1bn. "We hear of 366 community-based contractors employing 1,770 people to facilitate refuse removal services in our non-urban areas but let me ask any resident from KwaMakhutha or neighbouring areas whether refuse is removed regularly and to expectation, and they would honestly have to answer no.

It is a concept that has failed as a project – it needs to be stopped, investigated and re-launched but only after problems have been resolved and loopholes for political interference closed.

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# SA Cricket Awards TV host is a Toti thoroughbred

EX-KINGSWAY High School head boy, Fiso 'Mazzi' Mazibuko (29) was one of three hosts at the Cricket South Africa awards in Sandton on Saturday evening, 2 June.

The TV presenter, speaker and voice-over artist's duties on the night included hosting the red carpet and being the presenter who spoke to various award winners on stage.

"I was blown away to be asked but I never got carried away. I just told myself I would only smile about the awards once I had produced the goods on the day," he said.

"The first person I told was my mom who has been immense in my rise because no matter the setback, she has always supported me. The greatest gift she has ever given me was her belief in me no matter what I do. I love that woman so much."

Mazzi has been employed at SuperSport since 2013. He started as a SuperSport Blitz presenter and voice-over artist, before working his way to live broadcasts, with the Durban U19 international football tournament being his first foray into live TV. "It was very bumpy at the start. I struggled but eventually got to grips after numerous attempts. I attended an audition at SuperSport in 2013. Out of 300 of us, they only selected two. That was a special day and the start of my journey."

Mazzi was impressed with his performance at the cricket awards. "It went really well on Saturday. For such a big occasion it's all about making sure your nerves don't get the better of you and I think I controlled myself well.

The feedback I received after the awards

was also mind-blowing. Big people in the sports industry said I was one of the highlights of the night, which was really nice for me and it has done my confidence the world of good.

I did an interview with AB de Villiers after the night was wrapped up, for our cricket show Inside Edge and he said to me: 'Well done on tonight Mazzi, don't mess it up now'. I thought that was quite a funny moment."

Sport has always been a part of Mazzi's life since he was young. "When I was at Athlone Park Primary, I don't ever recall doing my homework - it was always drop your bags, hit the field and play cricket, hockey or soccer with friends and the children at aftercare. That grew with me but as I got to high school, the line between studies and sport balanced out a bit more."

Mazzi started to blossom as a sportsman in grade 9 when he was selected for the first time to play KZN cricket. He later made the SA U15 country districts cricket team and represented KZN Schools in cricket and hockey. He attended the Dolphins Cricket Academy, played first team tennis in grade 8 and was selected for the SA U17 cricket high performance squad, while also representing KZN at senior level for hockey with the Raiders U21, KZN Mynahs and KZN inland A team.

Mazzi was born and bred in Durban and was Kingsway High's head boy in 2005.

"I thoroughly enjoyed my years at Kingsway. The characters I went to school with were amazing, funny and difficult at times but we made good memories. I made lifelong friends, learnt a lot about myself and it's a time of my life I treasure.

My best memories were probably on the sports field. I remember in grade 11, our first team only lost one game the entire season, and that was against a strong Westville Boys first team.

I also have good memories in the classroom - I really enjoyed history with Mrs Goldie, and Mrs Phillips was an amazing maths teacher and someone who really inspired me to be a good person. Mrs Schroeder was full of life and always taught us to dream big. Mrs Smit was involved with the Amanzimtoti Cricket Club and she believed in me so much, along with Mr Peters and Mr Erickson."

After school Mazzi did post matric at Glenwood High School, before going to University of KwaZulu-Natal on a sports bursary. "My post matric experience was purely for sport, as I matriculated at the age of 17 and still wanted to make SA Schools cricket because I still qualified in terms of my age. During the year I did a sports psychology course through Intec College and I coached at the school.

My goal was to somehow be involved in sports after school. Initially I wanted to play cricket professionally but I soon realised that TV was where I wanted to be. Never in my wildest dreams did I think I would be where I am today and children should know where I come from and that dreaming and believing in yourself will take you far." Mazzi might live in Johannesburg now but he hasn't forgotten his roots. "I still get to visit Toti, as my family is still based in KZN. Toti will always be a place I call home. I miss my family, my brother Mbuso, my sister Zenani and my mom Nokukhanya. I miss the beach in Toti and I miss playing cricket at Hutchison Park. Every time I drive by there I fondly remember the time when I turned out for Amanzimtoti Cricket Club's first team, or when I used to play tennis at Tony Vermaak's holiday tournaments."

### Umkomaas rapist jailed for 10 years

A MAN who raped a 68-year-old woman in her Umkomaas kitchen after strangling her, has been jailed for 10 years by a Scottburgh court.

On 25 January, the woman was in her kitchen when Thulani Vincent Dube (43) grabbed her from behind and began strangling her. He threw her to the floor and raped her.

He was arrested on 1 February and appeared in Scottburgh Court on 18 May, where he was found guilty of rape and sentenced to 10 years' imprisonment. Investigator Const TP Ndlovu of Umlazi FCS worked hard to ensure a good sentence was meted out to the accused.

eThekweni Outer South cluster head of investigations, Col Anita Narayan said: "The commitment and professionalism of Const Ndlovu led to the securing of an excellent conviction of 10 years' imprisonment. We will ensure criminals who hurt our children and women face the long arm of the law and be imprisoned."

Smoking tyres, broken bottles and smouldering refuse compactors bear witness to a department in total disarray, while investigative reports confirm corruption, incompetence and no doubt 'jobs for pals' as reflected in the thousands of EPWP appointees who benefit from the R75.3m grant in return for their political loyalty but who are not prepared to do a day's work for a day's pay.

We recall the introduction of a two-bag collection system a few years ago which included the orange bag recycle programme.

Despite numerous enquiries, the orange bags became more and more difficult to obtain while the contractor persisted with a further two-year contract. That same company eventually made it onto the city's 'blacklisted 42', leaving the hard-fought recycle programme virtually non-existent."

Cllr Beetge questioned the lack in motivation to increase the rates base, collect uncollected debt or reduce water and electricity theft. "Instead the city seeks to re-evaluate and inflate property values along with a 6.9% rates increase, 2.8% above the inflation rate of 4.1%.

We call for incentivised payment schemes as some form of counter measure to recovering outstanding debt that has increased by R887m to R8.8bn in 2018 – this in comparison to R7.9bn in 2017, which accounts for a R2bn increase in the two-year period since 2016."

Cllr Beetge said Metro Police remains under-equipped with both logistical support and manpower. "Funding has to be prioritised to procure more vehicles, speed timing devices and equipment. In 2000, council resolved that come 2010, Metro Police should be a force of 5,000 members. Today it is half that number, yet with no apparent plan to address it."

## Crew contracted to flush stormwater system

COUNCIL'S coastal stormwater department has contracted the BMK group to survey and flush out the stormwater system in Amanzimtoti.

Ward 97 councillor, Andre Beetge said two trucks – a Hino with a jetting machine and a Mercedes with surveying equipment – will be in the area for about three months.

"The Hino truck will draw water from fire hydrants, which it will use to flush out any obstructions," he said. "If you see it, there is nothing sinister going on, it is a planned operation to test the stormwater system so that the department can plan any maintenance or upgrade to the system."

The two trucks travel together and motorists are urged to take caution when encountering them.

# Terry Cousins will be missed

WITH his unmistakable moustache, smiling eyes and warm interest in people, Pam Golding Properties principal Terry Cousins will be missed after his sudden death on Friday, 1 June at the age of 66 years.

Born in Durban, Terry lived and schooled on the Bluff before attending Durban High School and Maritzburg College. He studied accounting at UKZN and was a qualified CA.

He was employed in Pietermaritzburg and Secunda before joining Illovo Sugar as the administration manager for the Pongola and then Illovo sugar mills. The family loved camping in Midmar and spending holidays in Umtentweni and Maritzburg.

Daughter Bronwyn said her dad's foray into real estate started after her late mother joined the industry in 1990. He took over Warner Beach Estates which became Durban South Properties, before he converted to a Pam Golding franchise 22 years ago.

After the death of his wife, Terry shared his life with partner Carol Potgieter for more than 18 years.

"Terry was such a diverse, kind man and adored his grandchildren. He had a full life, and was a down-to-earth, widely loved man," said Carol. "His Friday afternoons were filled with spending time with staff members who needed a chat. His agents will recall his signature 'make a sale' slogan."

Carol's daughter Amelia said she appreciated how Terry had taken an active interest in her life, and while at times respectfully disagreeing with her about some decisions, he would be the first to support her regardless.

Son Michael said that while growing up, Terry had made the most of every opportunity to invest in his life, be it in sports, handiwork around the house or general life lessons. "Dad would always supported me on the sidelines at all my sporting activities. He also imparted

sound life advice, but always allowed me to make my own decisions."

Michael spoke with pride of how his dad had 'turned to mush and became a teddy bear' when his grandchildren came along. "It was amazing to see that transformation in him and he loved his grandchildren, who referred to him as 'Pops'."

Bronwyn relished the times he and Carol had visited her and her family when she stayed in various cities across the world. "Dad was larger than life in so many ways. He wasn't shy to speak with anyone or make a cheeky comment. He had character by the bucketload and was always up for a laugh and to share a drink and a good conversation. He would do anything for his family and had an 'old school' sense of right and wrong. He truly loved his friends, old classmates, anyone who went to Maritzburg College, colleagues, clients - I often felt like he seemed to know everybody in Toti, Maritzburg and beyond. It didn't take much for him to count you as a friend and take an interest in you. I will miss our talks very much and the big bear hugs only he could give. I'm sure Dad's

idea of heaven is a big golf course in the sky, with a drink in hand, the sun shining down, surrounded by friends and family giving him a hard time."

Terry and business partner, Tony Penfold served on council together when the former independent towns of Illovo, Kingsburgh, Isipingo and Amanzimtoti merged to form the South Local Council, which was incorporated into the Ethekwini Metro in 1994.

"He was as large as life, highly principled and forthright. We subsequently became business partners, and were in business together for some 20 years," said Tony.

"An avid golfer, he has an amazing circle of friends and contacts who together with his employees are going to miss him dearly."

Terry is lovingly remembered by his partner Carol, his children Bronwyn and Michael, his brothers Lynton and Craig, as well as their families including his five grandchildren, Zoey, Matthew, Zack, Amy and Megan. 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## Hijackers shoot motorist in foot

A HIJACKING victim was shot and dumped in Umlazi after he was hijacked in Toti on Thursday, 31 May. Lt Col Thulani Zwane of the SAPS KZN media centre said the complainant and a passenger were in the car when he was approached

by unknown men armed with a gun at about noon.

"The suspects forced the victims into the rear seat. The complainant struggled with the attackers and was shot in the foot. The criminals abandoned the vehicle in Umlazi's D section and fled with the motorist's cellphone. The motorist was taken to hospital and the vehicle was recovered."

Charges of carjacking, kidnapping and attempted murder are being investigated by Toti SAPS. In a separate incident on Tuesday afternoon, 5 June, a man was hijacked at Pipeline Beach by three armed men at about 2.30pm and also dropped in Umlazi.

## Cold spell bodes well for fast-moving sardines

IT is highly likely that some small, fast-moving pockets of sardines are already present off the KZN coast and nettings by the commercial seine netters may well take place during the coming weeks.

That's the feedback from the KZN Sharks Board which undertook its first monitoring flight of the 2018 sardine season on Thursday, 31 May.

"There are currently many shoals of various species of baitfish visible off the KZN coastline, especially noticeable during periods of calm sea conditions," it said.

"It is not possible to determine the different species of these baitfish from the air, however we have been sampling some of these

shoals and have found that they consist of mainly of mackerel, East Coast round herring and torpedo scads, among others.

It is also not uncommon to find occasional sardines mixed in among the shoals during this time of the year."

The board's main interest in the annual run is to ensure that any shoals of sardines that are accompanied by large groups of predators are monitored and that the shark safety gear is managed accordingly to minimise any negative environmental impact of the gear.

A keen Athlone Park sea watcher reported sightings of seagulls dive-bombing the ocean just beyond backline off Twini ledges on Tuesday morning.



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## K9 unearths burglar

A BURGLAR was collared by K9 officers on Monday, 4 June after three men broke into an Athlone Park premises.

The details were shared over the CCPO radio network and ET Rapid Response (ETRR) members joined the SAPS K9 unit to track them. "After a difficult search, one man was cornered on the river in KwaMakhutha, thanks to awesome co-operation between the locals, CCPO, SAPS dog handlers and ourselves," said ETRR's Tony Lokker. "A bush was surrounded while the dogs worked. The criminal was found by the dogs, hiding in a water pit under shrubbery. When one dog jumped into the water, the suspect quickly emerged. Well done to everyone, especially Umlazi K9 unit, whose dogs were trojans."

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An assortment of car theft tools were found in the criminals' car.

## Toti crime fighting noose tightens around car thieves

AFTER stealing more than 30 cars in the greater Amanzimtoti area last month, some car thieves' luck ran out on Saturday, 2 June thanks to the Community Crime Prevention Organisation (CCPO).

"We have been trying everything to catch them, with many early morning and evening patrols conducted, to no avail," said CCPO committee member, George Snodey.

That all changed when acting CCPO manager, Rupert Smit was at Winkle Beach early on Friday morning when he noticed a white VW Caravelle in the area, with occupants who were acting suspiciously.

When they noticed they were under surveillance, they drove out of the area. When questioned after their arrest, they said they had seen they were being observed by the CCPO, so decided to change vehicles and area.

The vehicle's details were shared over the CCPO radios, which Metro Police's dog unit shares. About 30 minutes later Snodey noticed a silver Etios where all the parkrun vehicles were parked in Beach Road between Shad Place and the main beach parking, with the Caravelle's registration number.

"Fortunately our Metro dog unit buddies were less than two minutes away. When the K9 guys pulled up to check them out, they raced off into Inyoni Rocks Road. At the intersection of Kingsway, they smashed into a Ford Bantam and headed north towards Galleria," said Snodey. With the K9 vehicle in hot pursuit, the getaway driver tried to make a sharp turn to get onto the freeway and throw his pursuer off, however with the wet roads, they slid out and hit the robot.

Before they could get out of the car, the K9 unit was on them, arresting all three men with an assortment of tools, computer boxes and remote jammers.

"This is a significant arrest, as these guys were causing havoc in the area. Thanks for the assistance from ET Rapid Response, Blue Security and Toti SAPS," said Snodey. "The area is too big for a small group to cover and all parties are important in these operations."

The CCPO is making a big impact in combating crime but we need everyone to assist. Whether you live in a complex or not, you have to venture out into the streets at some stage, and this is where you will rely on us.

They admitted they were going to steal a car belonging to someone doing the parkrun, they were just waiting for the car guard to move further away. Someone nearly had to jog home but thanks to the CCPO they arrived back at their parked car to find it was still there." To join the CCPO, call Snodey on 083-655-4302.

In a separate incident, a housebreaker was netted by the CCPO with stolen goods after he broke into a caravan in Dan Pienaar Drive on Thursday, 31 May. Two foot patrol guards posted in Dan Pienaar Drive saw the man carrying electrical extensions and other items at about 4am. "He was questioned and he took the guards to the caravan he had broken into." He was handed over to Toti SAPS.

# Fatal shooting in Prospecton

FOLLOWING the fatal shooting of Prospecton businessman Steve Celliers, who was shot dead in an ambush outside his business in Stroude Place on Friday morning, 1 June, a Durban private investigator friend mourned his loss in a social media post.

According to KZN SAPS spokesman, Captain Nqobile Gwala, Celliers was walking along the road at about 8.45am when two men ambushed him, calling out his name before they opened fire, fatally wounding him.

The unknown number of gunmen in a black VW Polo then fled the scene without taking anything. He was declared dead at the scene.

Celliers was the owner of SJ Logistics in Prospecton.

In a Facebook post titled 'Helpless/hopeless', private investigator Brad Nathanson said: "As I stood over my mate Steve Celliers' body yesterday where he lay in the street, gunned down by lawless cowards who didn't even have the stones to alight the car in which they were driving, I have never felt so helpless or so hopeless for the future of our country".

Offering his condolences to the Celliers family, he said: "I am so sorry Steve. I am sorry you had to die. I am sorry for the pain for those you have left behind and I am mostly sorry for the fact that our government, despite everything, is yet to show us law-abiding citizens that it is taking crime seriously, beginning with expedient trials and long sentences."

In another social media post, Andreas Mathios said: Another senseless shooting in Isipingo claims the life of a well-respected community member, formerly from Westville, taken in the prime of his life.

felt the need to empower these young children with skills they do not receive at their school," said librarian Slindile Mosia.

"The library services we offer were shared with the children such as e-books, which was introduced by Amanzimtoti library staff member Noluthando Mrwetyana, which was very interesting to them. "Let's use our smart phones in an educational way other than for social media and games that we always play," said Noluthando, who also taught the children how to become an e-book member.

## No waiting period to report a missing person - police

AMANZIMTOTI SAPS confirms there is no waiting period to report a missing person, irrespective of the circumstances surrounding their disappearance.

Captain Charlene van der Spuy dispelled the myth that there is a 24 hour waiting period before one

reports someone's disappearance.

As soon as a loved one is discovered missing, a missing persons report should be completed at your nearest police station.

A recent photograph of the missing person, together with full

details of when last the person was seen and a full description of the clothing worn at the time, must be recorded.

Any information regarding friends, family and places the person frequents will assist in the investigation.

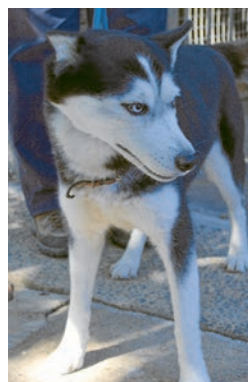

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## From this perspective

WITH World Environment Day having taken place this week (Tuesday, 5 June) and World Oceans Day ahead on Friday, 8 June, there are ambitious moves afoot to start cleaning millions of tons of plastic flotsam in the world's oceans.

These moves must be replicated in every ocean and in communities world-wide, if the plastic waste tide is going to be forced to turn.

More importantly, not only ocean-based but land-based initiatives are needed on a massive scale.

In SA, localised efforts take place every September during the International Coastal Clean-up, an annual effort that focuses on clearing the seashore of litter. Closer to home, Toti-based Clean Surf Project is a non-profit organisation which drives public awareness to assist with more regular drives to clear the shoreline. They also do outreaches at local schools, preaching about the ocean pollution pandemic. Locally this week, Wessa Treasure Beach is conducting a four

day clean-up of nearby Treasure Beach which ends on World Oceans Day.

Statistics quoted by www.plastic-pollution.org paint an horrific picture. With global plastic production having risen in the last half century to about 300 million tons of plastic per year, a 2015 study by a working group at UC Santa Barbara's

National Centre for Ecological Analysis and Synthesis quantified the input of plastic waste from land into the ocean. The results show that every year, eight million metric tons of plastic ends up in our oceans. That's the equivalent to five grocery bags filled with plastic for every foot of coastline in the world. The cumulative input by 2025 would be nearly

20 times the eight million metric tons estimate – 100 bags of plastic per foot of coastline in the world.

This simply can't continue.

Plastic's characteristics as a versatile, lightweight, flexible, moisture resistant, strong, and relatively inexpensive material have attracted mankind to its widespread uses. These are the very reasons it has become a worldwide pollution epidemic in our oceans. It is durable and very slow to degrade, meaning single-use plastics will exist in the environment beyond our own lifetimes.

The first-ever machine to clean up the planet's largest chunk of ocean plastic is due to tackle the eastern Great Pacific Garbage Patch (GPGP), located halfway between California and Hawaii. Its mission, which starts in July, is to collect the 1.8 trillion pieces of plastic rubbish amassed there by ocean currents. This waste will be recycled.

The Dutch teen, Boyan Slat who presented this

ocean-cleaning machine idea at a TedX Talk six years ago, dropped out of college to pursue his dream and raised millions in a crowdfunding campaign to bring about its realisation.

Recent research estimates the GPGP as spanning 617,763 square miles – a size larger than France, Germany and Spain combined which is said to contain 79,000 tons of plastic. The majority of it is made up of 'ghost gear', comprising of abandoned and lost fishing gear, including nets and ropes, often from illegal fishing boats. Scientists claim this gear kills more than 100,000 whales, dolphins and seals each year.

Sadly this isn't the only floating mass of junk. Others have been sighted in the western Pacific, South Pacific, Indian Ocean and two in the Atlantic.

It's clearly time for a global rethink on how we consume disposable materials and for a culture of re-use to become more innate. If not now, then when?

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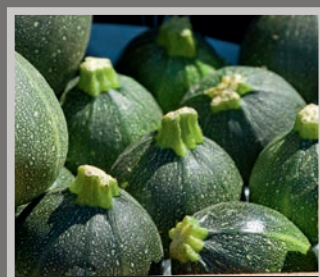
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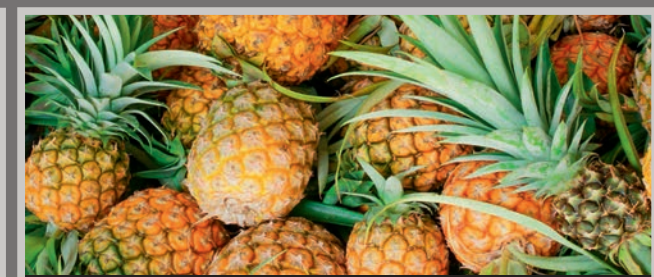

# Renault's hottest Clio driven

For many years the Renault Sport division has been producing some of the best driver's cars within the performance hatchback segment. Cars such as the Clio 182 Cup and Megane RS275 Trophy spring to mind from a local perspective.

However, with the brand looking to go more mainstream over the past five years or so, we've seen the proliferation of dual-clutch automatic gearboxes, slightly softer suspension setups and indeed, cars that appeal to a wider audience.

With some 40 years of Formula 1 involvement under its belt and a competitive team in the current F1 season, the RS brand has released another F1 inspired edition, this time based upon the Clio RS220 Trophy, which follows models such as the Megane RB8, Megane F1 and indeed the Clio R27. I had a chance to drive this new model around Zwartkops International Raceway in Pretoria recently.

Released in 2017, the RS220 Trophy on which the aptly named RS18 is based, is still a very sporty looking car, however, this latest limited edition variant really steps up the Clio's hot hatch game from a design perspective.

The car features Liquid Yellow accents on the front bumper blade, side sills and wheel centre caps, while in a rather bold move, all badging is finished in gloss black with black 18-inch alloy wheels, a black diffuser and gloss black grille completing the exterior transformation.

Inside, the RS18 resembles the regular Trophy with an Alcantara and leather-wrapped steering wheel, sporty leather seats, carbon look inserts and the seven-inch R-Link infotainment system with the RS Monitor, which provides driving data such as lap times, boost pressure, oil temperature and various other handy performance data.

The latest generation Clio RS has been slightly disappointing when compared to its razor-sharp older siblings such as the RS182 Cup and RS200 RB8. In its quest for sales, the Clio lost some of its driving magic, although the Trophy went a long way to remedying this.

Being very much the same car, albeit with, in my opinion, better tyres in the form of sticky Michelin Pilot Sports, the RS18 provides modern hot hatch thrills with the addition of modern conveniences such as an automatic gearbox and four-door practicality.

The perky 1.6-litre motor up front is unchanged, with 162kW/280Nm

transmitted to the front wheels through a six-speed dual-clutch gearbox. This allows the little Clio to get from 0-100km/h in 6.6 seconds.

The strong motor and stiff chassis in combination with the Akrapovic exhaust, which provides loud burps on upshifts, makes the Clio a very entertaining car to drive on a circuit.

In addition, the brakes performed admirably while the quick steering rack, lateral grip and traction were all grin-inducing. Out on the road, the Clio can settle down rather well, although that stiff suspension can prove rather unforgiving over our rough road surfaces.



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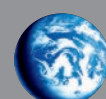
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# Driving pieces of BMW history

It's not every day that BMW South Africa invites you to drive a few of its most precious local models, so when the invitation came through, I pounced on the opportunity. With the brand now producing the X3 locally and having stopped production of the 3 Series at its production facility in Rosslyn, Pretoria, it was rather apt that I was invited to drive two other locally-produced models, the 333i and the 325is Evo 1.

## The first and the last

Upon arrival at Constitution Hill in Johannesburg, I was greeted by four BMW models, a blue X3, a white 340i and of course, the two iconic e30s mentioned above. At first glance the two newer cars seemed insignificant, that was until I was told that the 3 Series in front of me was the very last to be built at Plant Rosslyn and that the X3 to my left was the very first to roll out of the very same factory. I was simultaneously looking at the end of an era and the start of something new. The other benefit of having two modern BMW models there was the opportunity to experience just how different cars from the same manufacturer can feel when their production dates differ by three decades.

## Driving the classics

Up first, I hopped into the 333i, a vehicle produced for South Africa after news that an e30 M3 wouldn't be a possibility for the local market. With the M3 of that era featuring a four-cylinder motor, the 333i seemed like overkill,

with the 3.2-litre straight-six motor from the likes of the 733i and 633i CSI under the bonnet.

Stepping into the 333i I felt like a kid again, such excitement to view the 80's-style dashboard, the dog-leg gearbox, which puts first gear where second gear would usually be and of course, to listen to that massive motor on cold start.

I fired it up and looked for the air-conditioning switch, which in the 333i was an option, you could either have air-conditioning or power steering, not both, which means that the example that I was driving would do without the latter.

I slid the notchy gearbox into first and set off, burbling away through the streets of Johannesburg. The amazing thing about the 333i is how heavy the controls are and yet, how small the car is and indeed, how easy it is to see out of with that massive glass house.

You could spot the car enthusiasts from a mile away because they knew exactly how special these cars are and would whistle and shout as I cruised past.

The large lump up front produces fantastic low-down torque, and although not fast by modern standards, I could only imagine what an animal this must have been when it was released.

I got out on to the highway and decided to chase the redline in a few gears. Second to third shifts produced a faint chirp from the rear wheels while progress is steady and the sound absolutely intoxicating. The steering is heavy, but communicative and filled with feedback, it reminds you of what steering should probably feel like,



while the brakes remind you of how far we've come with stopping power.

In typical Johannesburg style, the traffic and later, the weather decided to take a turn for the worse. This meant that any meaningful stint in the 'Gusheshe', the nickname for the 325is, would be thwarted, so my colleague and I sat in traffic, discussing the restoration project that brought the 325is that we were driving in to near showroom condition while pining over the virtues of classic BMW ownership. Perhaps one day, on the right road, I'll have my chance to pin a Gusheshe, and then, all will seem right with this world.

Driving and being driven in these classic e30s was a throwback to when one indeed needed to be at their best to extract the very best from a car. It's an era that many, including myself for many years, struggled to understand, but simply driving one of these older cars will instil in you a respect for what real driving is all about, and that's the very essence of motoring itself.

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## Senegal coucal

THE Senegal coucal is very similar to Burchell's coucal but is smaller with a less heavy bill and shorter tail with green iridescence.

It is an uncommon resident found south of the Sahara in Zimbabwe, Northern Botswana and NE Namibia.

Usually solitary or in pairs,



they like rank grass, thickets in woodland, as well as reedbeds and dense riverine bush.

The bird's food preference is insects, small rodents, reptiles, birds, and birds' eggs.

Its voice is about 20 tooting notes, falling in pitch at first, then rising at the end.

It also has a clucking 'tok-tok-tok-tok' which is sometimes done in duet.

Breeding season is from October to February, when four white eggs are laid in a nest built of a ball of coarse, dry grass lined with leaves about four metres above ground in a leafy bush or thorn tree. Incubation is 18 to 19 days and nestlings remain for 18 to 20 days.

African tribesmen call it murenda or mkuku and in Afrikaans, it is known as die Senegalvleiloerie.
